

ACTIVITIES- 2022-2023

1. 21.6.2022 International Yoga Day Celebration :

Miss Shefali Shahu, B.Sc. IT part II and Ankit Sahu, of B.Com part II, who are also yoga instructors explained to the students about the importance and benefits of Yoga, Students learned techniques of various asanas like Tadasana, Vakrasana, Surya Namaskar, and breathing exercises like Anulom-Vilom, Bhramari, Kapalbhathi, etc. The importance of these was explained simultaneously. Vote of thanks was proposed by the NSS volunteer Om Ambulkat.



2. 4.7.2022 Eve- Teasing Awareness Program :

Mrs. Chanda Dandawate (API), Kalamna Police Station was invited as a chief guest for the program. She addressed students regarding the preventive measures for eve teasing. Eve teasers frequently undergo unnecessary touching, pushing, shoving, or vulgar comments on the public transports and streets, while on the other hand they are also frequently harassed at workplaces by male colleagues or bosses. These experiences severely hinder women's productivity as well as mobility. In the long run, these women and girls, their families, and thus the whole society suffer. Also, Mrs. Dandawate informed about Child helpline numbers and police assistance to prevent sexual harassment for dealing with complaints and conducting an enquiry.



3. 6.7.2022 A Report on Cyber Security Awareness Program :

The team of Police officers- Ms. Payal Sonawane (PC), Mr. Manoj Raut (PSI), Sanjay Mane (PSI), Harmesh Manmode (PSI) of Kalamna Police Station - Cyber crime Department conducted the awareness program. Mr. Bablu Thakur, Police Constable, Cyber crime department- Kalamna Police Station was the key speaker of the program.

The cyber security Awareness program was organized with the main objective of enhancing student's awareness and attitudes toward cyber security and safe and secure digital payment. Mr. Thakur gave some guidelines for handling social media like WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram etc and suggested privacy policies to make social media accounts more secure. He informed the students about the two-step authentication usage or password complexity for gmail accounts and about precautions to be taken while playing gaming platforms like PUBG. Ms. Payal Sonawane suggested the use of wallet for making secure digital payments and advised not to share OTP with anyone. She explained the procedures and guidelines for police assistance in case of any cyber attack and unauthorised transactions. Around 70 students were benefited from the program. The Program concluded by a vote of thanks by Mrs. Nisha Vyas.



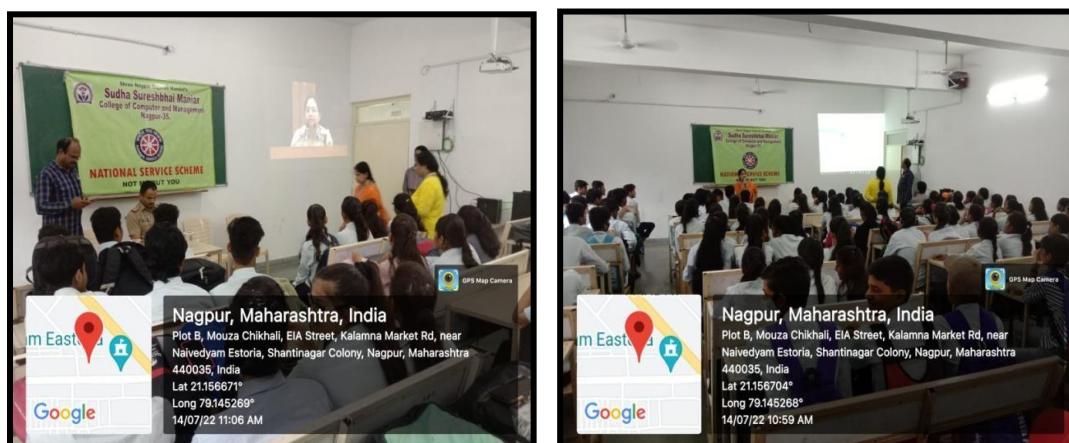
4. Pradhan Mantri Yojana awareness Program :

5. 14.07.2022 Anti Narcotics Awareness Drive :

NSS Unit of our college participated in the the online platform organized by the Nagpur Crime Branch Police, NARCOTIC DRUGS AND PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES CELL (NDP) at National Fire Service College Nagpur on 14th July 2022. 'Say no to drug Abuse' was the theme of the wonderful initiative taken by the Nagpur Crime Branch. Mr. Harmesh Parmar, Head Constable of the Kalmana Police Confidential Section, sought permission to set up this program in our college, Chinmay Pande, Deputy Police Detention Officer, launched the Event. He outlined the significance of this drive and its goals. He described how drugs influenced people's physical, mental, and social conduct. Ms. Aswati Dolje Joint Commissioner of Police, described the various strategies used by the Drug Mafia to turn young people into drug addicts. She urged students to not take any eatable items from unknown persons on the college premises. She also requested that if they found any student or any person who was behaving unusually they should immediately contact the police. There were many dignitaries who enlightened the students with their ideas, knowledge, and experiences. Dr. Shreyas, a psychiatrist explained that drugs, alcohol and smoking may be temporary stress relievers but were carcinogenic in the long run and that they attacked the central nervous system and put a person in a mental state where you no longer could think rationally and crave for more drugs. A video in which a teenager and healthy swimmer, falls prey to smoking and drinking was shown and eventually, he loses his health and turns into a weak, pale guy. The video was an eye opener for the students.



6. 30.7.2022 Covid-19 Vaccination Camp (Booster Dose) Vaccination Camp (Booster Dose):

This was organized (third dose) in association with NMC Public Health Care Centre for the faculty and parents of the students on 30th July 2022. Both Covishield and Covaxin were available. 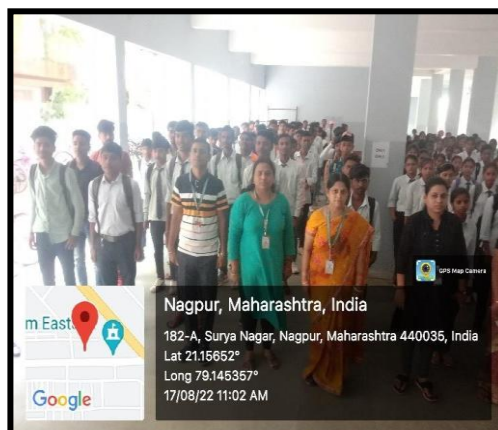
10. 14.8.2022 Hindi Diwas :

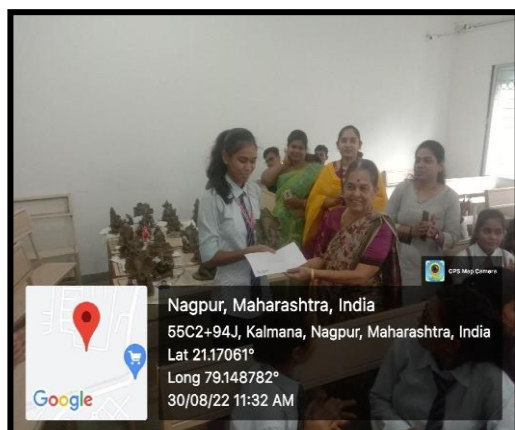
11. 20.8.2022 Sadhbhavna Day :

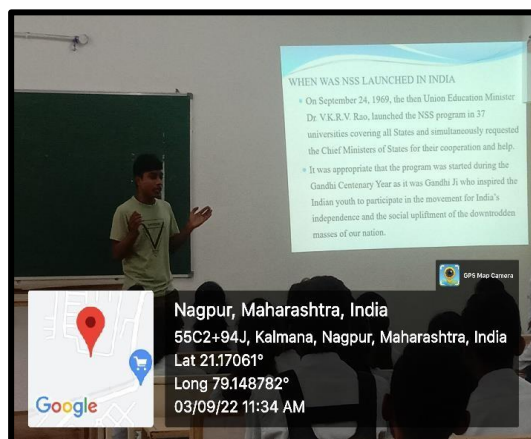
12. 29.8.2022 Report on “Eco-friendly Ganesha Idol Making” :

To ensure community mobilization and increase people's participation, every year the month of September is observed as “Rashtriya Poshan Maah” across the country. To participate in this activity NSS unit of our college organized a Guest Lecture on “Functional food and Nutraceuticals” specially for girls students on 17th September, 2022 at 10.30 a.m. by Dr. Rekha Sharma Assoc. Professor, UGC Human Resource Development, Centre, RTMNU. She explained that Functional foods are defined as products that resemble traditional foods but possess demonstrated physiological benefits. However, nutraceuticals are commodities derived from foods but are used in the medicinal form of pills, capsules, or liquids. She also informed students about the nutrient value of our local food. We should eat seasonal food to keep ourselves healthy. She also focused on the consumption of millets like jawar, bajra etc. The program concluded with a vote of thanks by Vaishnavi Rajput. 102 students were present during the program.

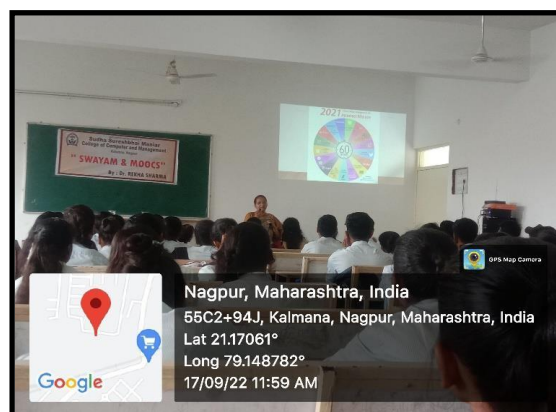


17. 17.9.2022 Guest Lecture on “Swayam and MOOC” :

The chief guest of the program was Dr. Rekha Sharma coordinator of SWAYAM and Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University. She explained that SWAYAM (Study Webs of Active-Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) and MOOC (Massive Open Online Courses) platform was developed indigenously by AICTE in 2016 to facilitate the hosting of online courses which could be accessed by anyone, anywhere at any time free of cost to achieve three cardinal principles of Education Policy viz. access, equity, and quality. SWAYAM is one of the world’s biggest MOOCs covers subjects from high school onwards till higher education including skill based courses to ensure that every student benefits from learning material through ICT. She further explained that The courses hosted on SWAYAM are in 4 quadrants –

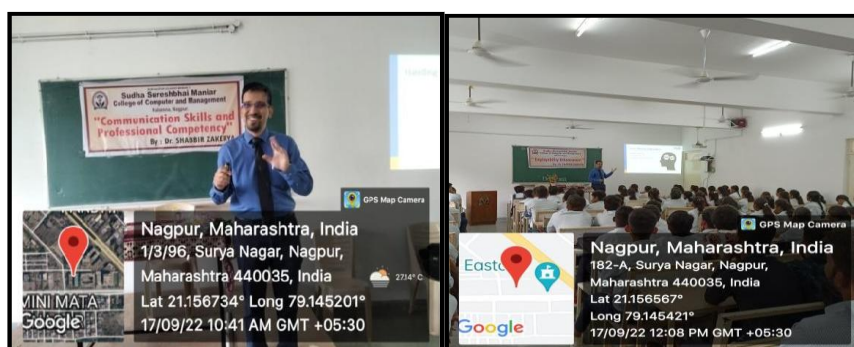
- (1) Video lectures,

She advised the use of 2-factor authentication while using apps and also advised the use of strong passwords that would make it harder for a hacker to guess them. The program received an overwhelming response from the students and the students were a happy lot for having gained very useful tips on protecting themselves from cyber crimes.



21. 1.10.2022 Sickle Cell Screening Camp :

Sickle cell disease is a preventable but inherited disorder of red blood cells, These illnesses are chronic, life-impairing, and in some cases, life-threatening. To create awareness about Sickle cell anaemia, a camp was organized in association with “Sickle Cell association”, Nagpur on 1st Oct 2022. The purpose of the program was the prevention of birth of children affected with Sickle cell anaemia, through well-planned screening programs, information dissemination, and awareness generation activities and help avert the imminent threat of this genetic disorder turning into a major health problem. 183 students were tested and 12 students were found to be positive. A counselling session was also conducted for the positive students and their parents by the association.



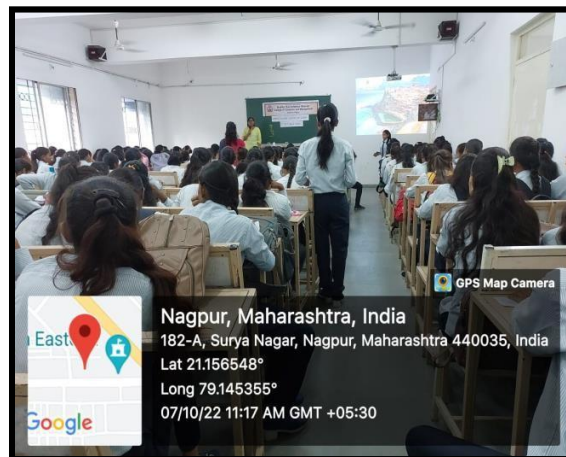
22. 7.10.2022 Blood Donation Camp :

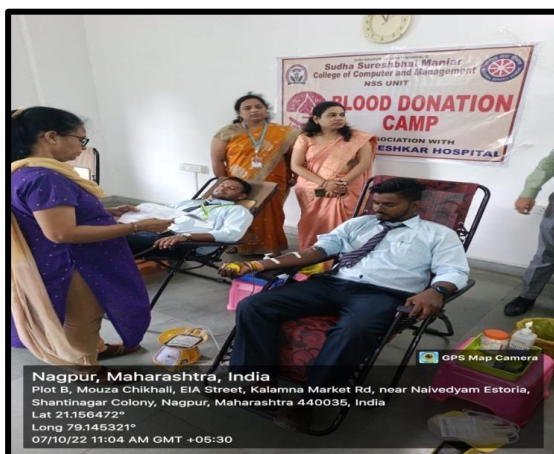
23. 7.10.2022 Gynecological Counseling Session :

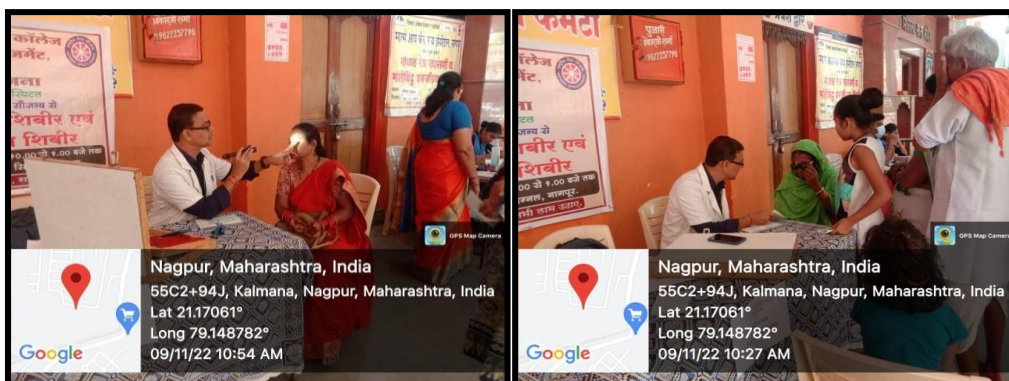
25. 31.10.2022 National Unity Day:

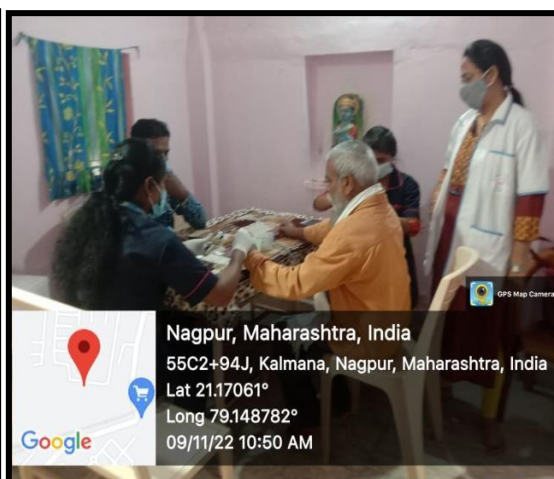
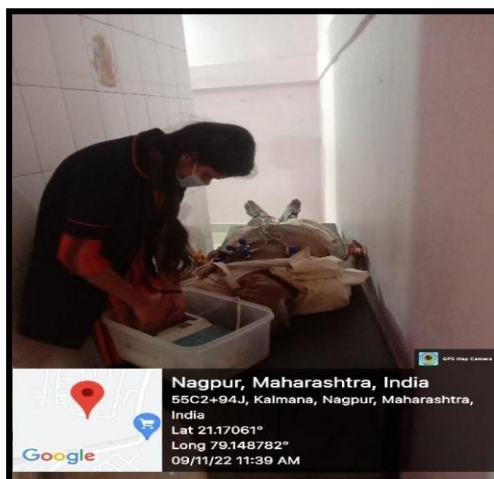
27. 9.11.2022 Sickle Cell Screening Camp :

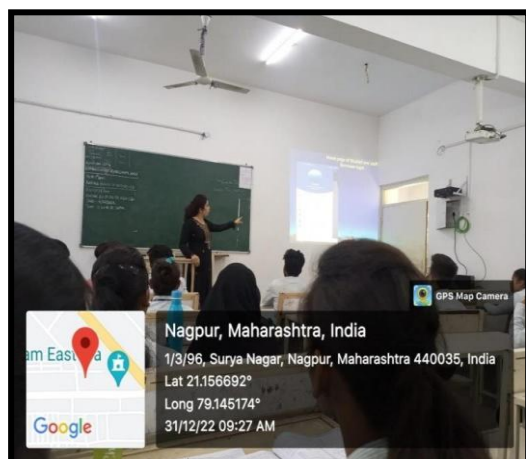
30. 15.12.2022 Visit to NGO “Samarpan”

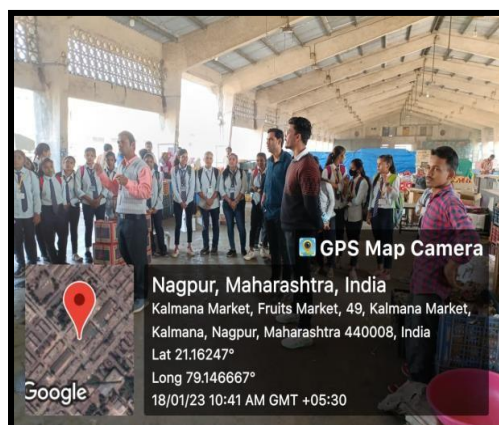
31. 31.2.022 Usage of M-OPAC for Students :

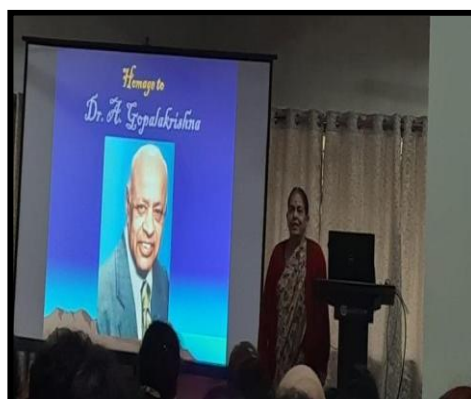
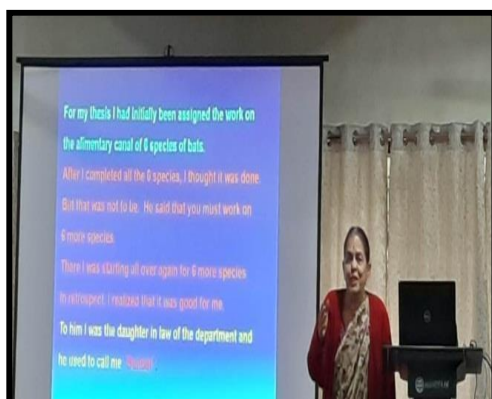
33. 3.01.2023 to 7.01.2023 Students and staff visited 108th Indian Science Congress:

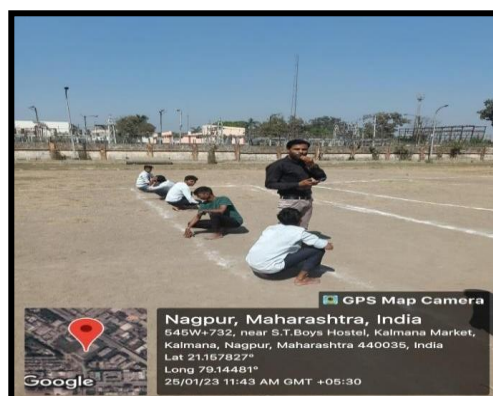
34. Dr. S.A. Bhide, key note speaker at 108 Indian Science Congress :

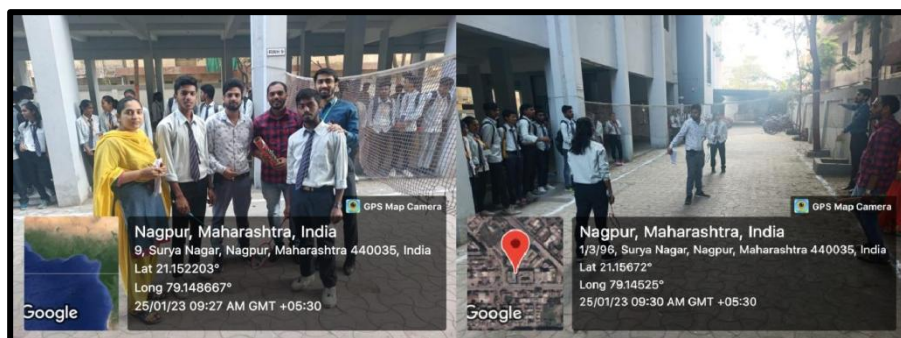
35. KHO-KHO Competition:

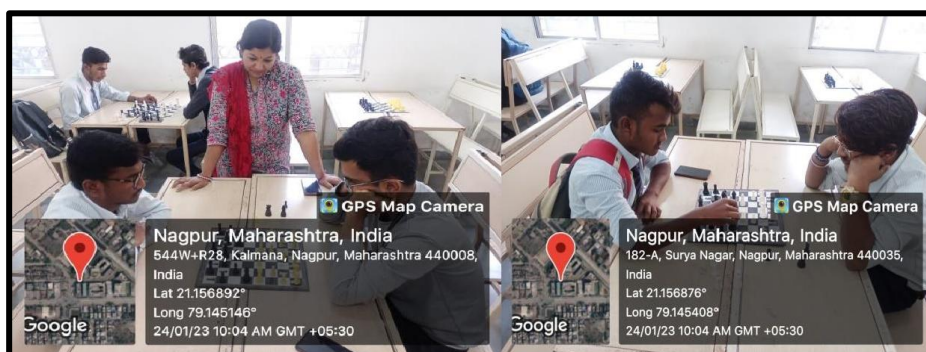

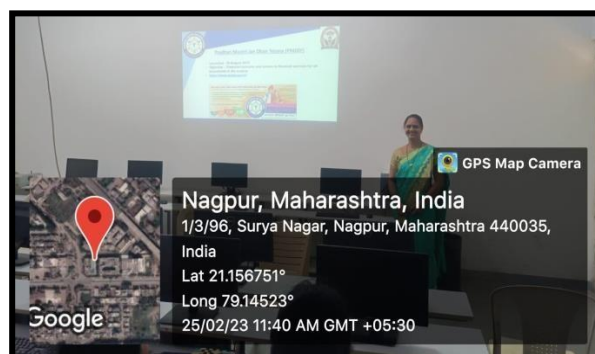
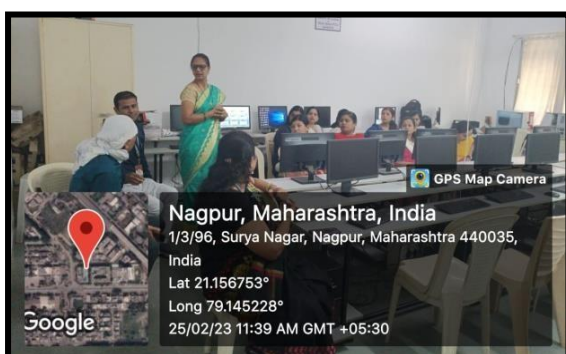

51. Code of conduct and PM Yojanas :

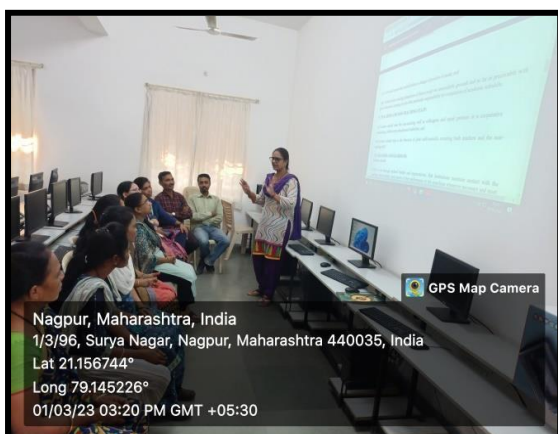
